### ***I am interested in volunteering in the following area(s):***

- Homeroom Parent** – Grades P – 5 Work with your child's teacher throughout the school year with planning class parties, and special projects. Duties will vary by classroom. This is an ongoing commitment which requires very little of your time.
- Computer Lab** – Grades K – 1 Attend weekly computer labs with your child's class. Lab time ranges from 30 to 60 minutes depending upon grade level. Assist younger students log on to the computer, and enter the program they'll be using for the day. Older students may need assistance working through the project assigned for the day. Simple instructions are provided, and being a computer guru is not a requirement.
- Rainbow Phrases** – Grades K – 5 Test students weekly on unit phrases. (sight words).
- Rainbow Math** – Grades K – 5 Work one-on-one with students weekly or bi-weekly on basic math facts and number recognition.
- Classroom Assistance** – Grades P – 5 Fun and easy! One-on-one and small group projects, no experience is required, just a desire to help our students succeed.
- Rock & Read** – Grades K – 5 Spend 30 to 60 minutes reading or listening to children read on a weekly basis. Training will be provided.
- Field Trips** – Grades P – 5 Attend field trips with your child's class. Assist Cleveland staff with supervision of the children. Some field trips require parent volunteers to work with a small group throughout the trip. Times and dates vary depending on grade.
- Popcorn Sales** – Help pop popcorn and bag it for classrooms. Usually requires 2 hours.
- America Reads Day - (Friday, October 21, 2011)** – Demonstrate the importance of reading. Read to small groups of children. Help volunteers locate classrooms. Many other duties are open throughout this day. You will be contacted regarding specific duties and times.
- America Reads Coordinator** – Involves working closely with Volunteer Coordinator and coordinating reading times with teachers and volunteers. Finding celebrity readers for the event.
- Jump Rope for Heart – (Friday, March 23, 2012)** No jump rope talent needed. Help with prizes, drinks, and snacks. **VERY FUN!**
- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Fiddles** – Help students under the guidance of the Cedar Rapids Symphony. Daily in the spring from 8:05AM to 8:40AM. 2 to 3 week commitment. **No experience necessary.**
