

The Value of ENERGY STAR Certification

ENERGY STAR® is the government-backed symbol for energy efficiency, providing simple, credible, and unbiased information that individuals and organizations rely on to make well-informed decisions.

An ENERGY STAR certified property meets strict energy performance standards set by EPA and uses less energy, is less expensive to operate, and causes fewer greenhouse gas emissions than its peers.

ENERGY STAR certified buildings and plants operate among the top 25 percent of similar facilities nationwide, with no sacrifices in comfort or quality. Buildings that earn EPA's ENERGY STAR use 35% less energy and generate 35% fewer greenhouse gas emissions than similar buildings across the nation.
